University Name	Jeju National University
Introduction of University	Jeju National University (JNU) is the only state-designated Flagship Korean National University on Jeju, an island that has been awarded UNESCO's triple crown in the field of natural science and was dubbed a New Seven Wonders of Nature. Since its opening in 1952, JNU has worked to cultivate talent who will change the future under the vision of "the university faithful to the basics and the university prepared for the future." The nation's university assessment has named JNU as having the best educational environment in terms of the ratio of full-time professors to students and per capita educational expenses. This proves that JNU has advanced its educational environment to the next level. JNU runs 15 colleges, 1 graduate school, 3 professional graduate schools and 6 specialized graduate schools. Particularly, it boasts of well-established teacher's colleges for potential primary and secondary teachers and a comprehensive medical education system that involves colleges specialized in medicine, pharmacy, nursing and veterinary medicine. To nurture global talent, JNU runs a customized curriculum that offers students all types of courses from fundamental to advanced levels. Currently, JNU has 11,200 international students from nearly 48 countries and networks with an estimated 323 universities from more than 50 countries including the United States. It has fully established this network of global education and students are encouraged to participate in its overseas internship program, intensive English education program and student exchange program.

Eligibility	 Students who are enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at their home university and will be continued to enroll during the exchange period in JNU. Students who have a good academic record. (Over GPA 2.7/4.3 or 80/100) Students who can communicate in English or Korean. Students who are in good health, both mentally and physically, to study in Korea for the full duration of exchange program. Students who have strong academic interest in Korea and Jeju.

It should indicate that students planning to study for 2 semesters have a minimum of 16 million KRW or more, while students planning to study for 1 semester should have a minimum of 8 million KRW or more in their possession.
Study Programs for Exchange Students	 Academic Classes (Except for Education, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Law, and Pharmacy) Students who are fluent in Korean or have TOPIK level 3 or higher can take major and general education classes because most of the undergraduate and graduate courses are taught in Korean. Some department (major) might require higher level of Korean language proficiency than TOPIK level 3. There are English medium classes in some majors and general education. Please find the subjects in the attachment. Korean Language Program Exchange students can take Korean Language Program, a full time language course. They can join 183 hours of courses (15-17 weeks, 12 credits) during a semester. (Mon-Fri 9:00-13:00) (Timetable is subject to change according to the program)
Maximum Credits	18 credits for undergraduate students 9 credits for graduate students (Korean Language Program and OIA's Exchange Student Only classes are exceptional.)
Tuition Fee	Exchange students pay tuition fees in the home university and do not pay in the host university according to the Agreement on Student Exchange between two universities.



Accommodation (JNU Student Dormitory)	Exchange students must live in the Student Dormitory unless they have their own housing in Jeju. Double room with a bathroom (No deposit, no kitchen) 800,000~890,000 Korean Won per semester (Vary by building, vacation period not included) Students have to bring their own bedding or purchase after arrival. *Payment must be made before arrival as requested through wire transfer.
How to make a payment for Dormitory fee	To ensure a smooth process, students are required to complete the international wire transfer before their arrival. The invoice will be sent via email once the application is done.
Meal Plan (JNU Student Dormitory)	Students can purchase a meal plan if they want to use the dormitory cafeteria. Korean cuisine meals are provided in the cafeteria. The rate varies by plans.
Health Insurance	As of March 1, 2021, all international students (D-2 visa) are required to subscribe Korea's National Health Insurance. National Health Insurance subscription is automatically done after your foreign registration at Jeju immigration office, but it takes about 1-2 months. Bring your own overseas health insurance for at least from September to October. International students' National Health Insurance is about 72,000 Korean Won per month. Students pay next month insurance on every 25th in previous month.
